

4-H Fashion Revue

Description: Outfits/Garments can be constructed, modified, or purchased. All

outfits/garments will be judged against each other.

Entries: Individual Only

State Award: 4-H State Contests Jacket

National Award: Determined at the National Level

General Information:

Fashion Revue is a combination of an oral presentation, modeling of the garment and response to questions from the judges . The contest will be broken into 2 parts: personal interview and fashion revue modeling.

a. Contestants will meet for a personal interview with the judges. During the interview, the contestant s will be judged on: their oral presentation skills, the content of their oral presentation, the appearance of outfit/garment, and to questions from the judges. During the interview, contestants will have the opportunity to provide an oral presentation in front of the judges. The presentation should be in the following format:

1. Name

- 2. One two minutes or less presentation about their 4-H Clothing and Textiles project. This oral presentation can include information about the garment being modeled, learning experiences or activities within the clothing and textiles project, future project/personal plans, and any other information related to their 4-H career.
- b. Contestants will participate in a fashion show where they will have an opportunity to model in a way to showcase their outfit/garment. Judges will score the contestants on their modeling skills. Contestants will also be asked to model their garments in a fashion show at the State Contests Banquet without judges. The Fashion/Display/Talent Show and Banquet will be Tuesday evening. Contestants will meet at 4:15pm for a full dress rehearsal on stage.



Judging -

20% - oral presentation

20% - content of oral presentation

20% - appearance of garment

20% - responses to judge's questions

20% - modeling

Ties will be broken by the judges.

Fashion Revue Construction Interview Questions

- What is one thing you learned?
- What sewing experiences have you had?
- Why do you sew? Fit? Originality? Cost?
- What was a new technique for you in sewing this garment?
- What alterations if any did you have to make to the pattern?
- Tell us about other sewing projects?
- What surprised you about making this?
- Which technique did you find the easiest?
- Which technique did you find the most difficult?
- What is your next sewing project?
- How do you think your constructed garment compares with purchased garments?



- Where do you plan to wear this outfit?
- Why is this fabric a good choice for your garment? Describe fabric
 characteristics that make it suitable for the intended use of the garment.
- Why did you choose to construct this garment rather than buy it?

Fashion Revue Purchased Interview Questions

- Tell me how you went about selecting this outfit.
- What considerations did you use when you selected this outfit? (fiber, fabric, design, construction)
- How does this outfit meet your clothing needs?
- Explain how and why the style of this outfit is appropriate for your figure type.
- Are the fibers in your garment natural or man-made?
- How will you care for this garment? Is there any additional cost to consider when caring for this garment?
- Why is this fabric a good choice for your garment? Describe fabric characteristics that make it suitable for the intended use of the garment.
- What information does the garment's hangtags give you?
- Why did you select the particular style, color(s), and/or fabric(s)?
- Do you have a clothing budget? If so, who determines the budget amount?
- As you selected the pieces for this outfit, what did you learn about price and quality?
- In your comparison shopping, what did you consider the most important thing to look for?
- What is your "cost per wearing"?
