THE 2004 UTAH YOUTH SUMMIT

The Sixth Annual Utah Youth Summit will be held Thursday, October 28—Saturday, October 30, 2004. This three-day retreat is designed to teach individuals from around the state the skills to be effectively engaged in their communities. It will focus on creating youth-adult partnerships, identifying community needs and resources, leadership skills, promoting youth voice, fostering individual commitment to lifelong service, and involvement in community youth service teams. Applications for teams of four youth and one adult to attend the summit will be available in May 2004.

PRESIDENT'S VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARD

Award is given to individuals, families and groups that have demonstrated outstanding volunteer service and civic participation over the course of a 12-month period. Eligibility requirements vary by age.

This award honors youth who have performed outstanding service in their communities and are making a positive impact in their local areas. Award categories include: individual youth, ages 14 and younger; individual youth, ages 15-18; and a youth group.

PRESIDENTIAL FREEDOM SCHOLARSHIPS

Each high school in the country may select up to two students to receive a \$1000 scholarship in recognition for their outstanding leadership in service to the community. The students selected may be either high school junior or seniors. The Corporation for National and Community Service provides \$500 for each scholarship, which must be matched with \$500 secured by the school from a local service club, business or other organization.
